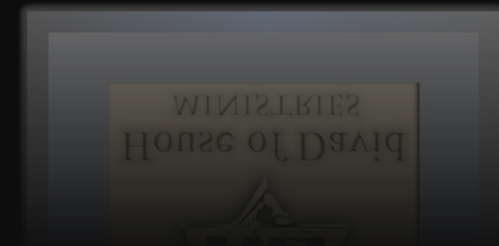

# The Feasts of The Lord



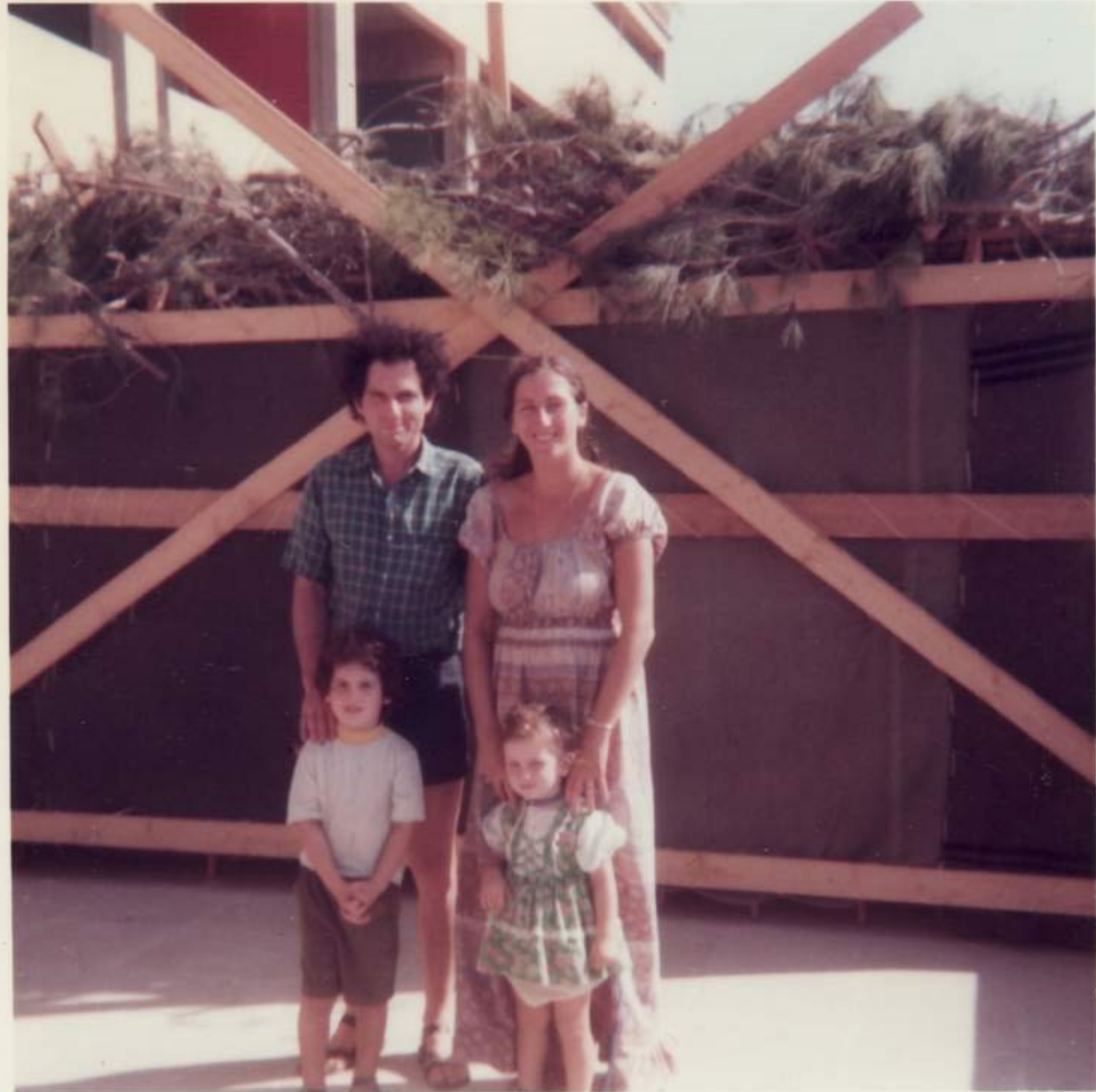

# Weekly and Annual Convocations



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- ❖ There are eight feasts and festivals, called holy convocations.
- ❖ The Sabbath is a weekly holy convocation.
- ❖ The remaining seven are annual convocations.

# The Spring Festivals



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1. The Lord's Passover.
2. The Feast of Unleavened Bread.
3. The Feast of First Fruits.
4. The Feast of Weeks.

# The Fall Holy Days



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5. The Feast of Trumpets.
6. The Day of Atonement.
7. The Feast of Tabernacles.



# Seven Annual Convocations



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- ❖ The seven annual convocations are prophetic milestones, correlating with significant biblical events that Christ has and will fulfill.

# The Passover



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α “Now on the first day of the Feast of the Unleavened Bread the disciples came to Jesus, saying to Him, ‘Where do You want us to prepare for You to eat the *Passover*?’” (Matthew 26:17).

# Christ Our Passover



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**α** “Therefore purge out the old leaven, that you may be a new lump, since you truly are unleavened. For indeed Christ, our *Passover*, was sacrificed for us” (1 Corinthians 5:7).

# Pesach or Pascha



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❖ Bible does not use the word Easter; it uses a transliteration of the Hebrew *Pesach*, Latin *Pascha*, and Greek *Pascha* (Britannica).

# The Living Bread



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α “I am the living bread which came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever; and the bread that I shall give is My flesh, which I shall give for the life of the world” (John 6:51).

# First Day of The Week



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**α** “Now after the Sabbath, as the first day of the week began to dawn, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to see the tomb” (Matthew 28:1).

# Christ The Firstfruits



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α “But now Christ is risen from the dead, and has become the *firstfruits* of those who have fallen asleep” (1 Corinthians 15:20).



# Assembled In Jerusalem



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❖ “And being assembled together with them, He commanded them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the Promise of the Father” (Acts 1:4).

# The Day of Pentecost



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**α** “When the *Day of Pentecost* had fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting” (Acts 2:1-2).

# Pentecost and Shavuot



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- ❖ Pentecost, Greek *Pentēkostēs*, is feminine of the ordinal of fiftieth, which is to count fifty days from the Passover (Strong's G4005).
- ❖ In Hebrew *Shavuot*, meaning Weeks, is commonly translated in the Old Testament as the Feast of Weeks.

# Jesus Fulfilled the Feasts



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- ❖ Careful study of scripture reveals that Jesus precisely fulfilled each of the first four holy convocation, exactly on the days commanded to be observed per the Hebrew calendar.
- ✓ What should this tell us about the last three convocations?

# The Day of Blowing Trumpets

✂ “And in the seventh month, on the first day of the month, you shall have a holy convocation. You shall do no customary work. For you it is a day of blowing the trumpets” (Numbers 29:1).

✓ Why do we blow trumpets?

# The Day of Atonement



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✚ “Also the tenth day of this seventh month shall be the Day of Atonement. It shall be a holy convocation for you; you shall afflict your souls, and offer an offering made by fire to the Lord”

(Leviticus 23:27).

# Atonement for God's Land and People



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❖ “Rejoice, O Gentiles, with His people; For He will avenge the blood of His servants, And render vengeance to His adversaries; He will provide atonement for His land and His people” (Deuteronomy 32:43).

✓ Why does God provide atonement for land?



# Feast of Tabernacles



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✚ Speak to the children of Israel, saying: ‘The fifteenth day of this seventh month shall be the Feast of Tabernacles for seven days to the Lord’” (Leviticus 23:34).

# All Nations To Go Up



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✂ “And it shall come to pass that everyone who is left of all the nations which came against Jerusalem shall go up from year to year to worship the King, the Lord of hosts, and to keep the Feast of Tabernacles” (Zechariah 14:16).

✓ Why are the nations celebrating this feast?

# In This Mountain



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✂ “And in this mountain The Lord of hosts will  
make for all people A feast of choice pieces”

(Isaiah 25:6).

✓ What do mountains symbolize?

# An Everlasting Covenant



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❖ Ho! Everyone who thirsts, Come to the waters... Listen carefully to Me, and eat what is good, and let your soul delight itself in abundance. Incline your ear, and come to Me. Hear, and your soul shall live; and I will make an everlasting covenant with you—The sure mercies of David” (Isaiah 55:1-3).

# The Return of Christ



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- ❖ The Fall Holy Days prophetically and spiritual point to the return of Christ.
- ❖ They are for Israel, but they are also for the nations.
- ❖ We, the church, are not to remain separate from Israel, but are to become One with her.

# Many Nations



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✚ “Many nations shall be joined to the Lord in that day, and they shall become My people. And I will dwell in your midst. Then you will know that the Lord of hosts has sent Me to you”

(Zechariah 2:11).

# The Cultivated Olive Tree

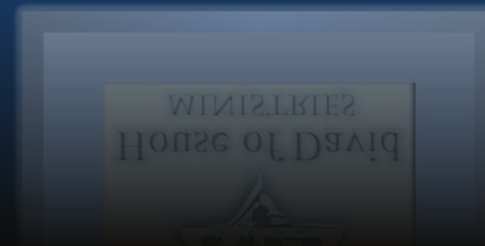
